Continued from page 51 U.S. that's heated entirely by geothermal energy produced on-site.

The new owners at Reno's 1,993-room Grand Sierra Resort have initiated a renovation to the tune of approximately \$20 million. The main lobby already has undergone a chic upgrade, and now it's the guest rooms' turn. A new lounge, Wet, and a small-plate Mexican restaurant, Cantina, have both recently debuted. The resort has more than 200,000 square feet of meeting space, which soon will be renovated as well.

The long-discussed **Boulder Bay** project in North Lake Tahoe has been approved by the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency. Plans call for a four-story, 275-room hotel with a 10,000-square-foot casino, to be built over three years. On the site of the former Tahoe Biltmore, Boulder Bay will be designed as a "cultural village" in an environmentally sustainable manner. Construction could begin this year.

TAXES

Reno, Sparks, northeast side of Lake Tahoe: room tax, 13% to 13.5%; sales tax, 7.725%; total tax on hotel rooms, 13% to 13.5% (a \$2 room tax is added to downtown Reno hotels with unrestricted gaming licenses)

Southeast side of Lake Tahoe (Douglas County, Nev.): room tax, 13%; sales tax, 7.1%; total tax on hotel rooms, 13%

California side of South Lake Tahoe: city room tax (non-redevelopment area), 10%; city room tax (redevelopment areas only), 12.02%; city tourism assessment, \$3 per occupied hotel room, \$4.50 per occupied condo/timeshare unit; sales tax, 7.75%

GROUP VENUE

Campo, which means "gathering spot" or "meeting place" in Italian, is a downtown Reno restaurant that debuted last November. The place revels in the use of organic, local and seasonal ingredients in an ever-changing menu. Specialties of the house include handmade pasta, Neapolitan pizzas and house-cured salumi. The airy interior affords views of the kitchen, the curing case and a wood-burning pizza oven imported from Naples. The room opens onto a large riverside patio. A semi-private room seats 30; buyouts can accommodate up to 120 diners, or 220 with the patio open. (775) 737-9555; campo reno.com
